Comparing Sexual Behaviour

- Quality vs. Quantity
 - Duration vs. Frequency
- Variable definitions of sex & sexual activity
- Issue of question relevance:
 - Sexual Intercourse
 - Penetration
 - Oral Sex
- Current Study: Focus on "the encounter"

Current Study

- Part of a larger longitudinal relationships study
- Online Survey began in 2005 and is ongoing
- Measures:
 - Relationship Satisfaction
 - Sexual Satisfaction
 - Mental Health & Physical Health
 - Social Support for the Relationship
 - Sexual & Health Behaviours
 - Sexuality and Sexual Identity

Current Analysis

- How long did your last sexual encounter with your partner last?
- How long does your average sexual encounter with your partner last?



Sample Demographics

	Female	Male	Total
Same-Sex	210	210	420
Mixed-Sex	287	106	393
Total	497	316	813

Age

■ 18 – 79; Mean: 30.32

■ Heterosexual Mean Age: 25, Non-Heterosexual Mean Age: 35

Relationship Length


Average length: 4.5 years


■ Range: < 1 month – 39 years


4 Group Comparison


- Lesbian Women
- Gay Men
- Heterosexual Men
- Heterosexual Women

Lesbians reported longest durations, followed by gay men, heterosexual men and then heterosexual women.











% Reporting 45 min+




% Reporting 1 hour +

Specific Activities

- Heterosexual Men & Women reported most frequent sexual intercourse
- Lesbians reported more frequent experiences of:
 - Multiple orgasms
 - Orgasms from oral sex
- Heterosexual Men reported more frequent experiences of:
 - Orgasm from vaginal intercourse
- Gay Men and Lesbians reported more frequent:
 - Performance of oral sex on their partner
- Heterosexual Women reported most frequent experiences of:
 - Sexual activity with partner that did not result in an orgasm
- Gay & Bisexual Men reported most frequent experience of orgasm through anal penetration

Conclusions

- The question you ask matters:
 - Sexual intercourse = heterosexuals
 - Duration = lesbians
 - Sex without orgasm = heterosexual women
 - Anal penetration = gay and bisexual men
- Longer durations could be an explanation for lower frequencies
- Frequency likely does not equate to quality
- Bottom line = satisfaction
